## In-Text Citations

In MLA format, every **in-text citation** includes the same one or two things:

- A. Whatever appears **first** in the Works-Cited page entry (usually an author name, sometimes an article title or organization name).
- B. Page Number (if available or applicable)

Whenever you quote, paraphrase, or summarize information from a website, article, or book, you can include an in-text citation at the **end** of the sentence.

### For example:

#### Works Cited Entry:

Toensmeier, Eric. *Paradise Lot: Two Plant Geeks, One-Tenth of an Acre, and the Making of an Edible Garden Oasis in the City*. White River Junction: Chelsea Green Publishing, 2013. Print.

**In-Text Citation:** (Toensmier 56).  
*This includes a page number (56) because the book has page numbers.*

**In-Text Citation:** ("Legal Notice").  
*In this case, we can skip the page number because this website doesn't have one.*
